Daniel Giamario is joined this month by

the partial Solar Eclipse and Total Lunar
Eclipse of this next lunation. This is the
first Eclipse season of 2022. All four
Eclipses of this year feature the Taurus-
Scorpio/Nodal axis. There are two
really long total Lunar Eclipses and two
partial Solar Eclipses. We will discuss
the possible repercussions globally and
on personal charts. We will also look at
the connections with global prominent
people. In addition, we will reference
the gorgeous Venus/Jupiter conjunction
and Pluto stationary retrograde that
amplify the partial Solar Eclipse. To find

Hi everyone. It's that time of the month
that I get to do my video blog rant and
this I get to do this one today I'm with
Mary Kern again. Thank you for helping
me out with this.

And to the subject today is kind of a
follow-up to the article that I wrote in
the in a previous newsletter about the
Eclipse season. And we're recording this
a few days before the New Moon and
the Solar Eclipse and we hope to have
this in the newsletter that you hopefully
will get before the actual New Moon
and the Full Moon, so we have a lot to
discuss with this. And so Mary... oh

and as we speak today, it's on April 28th, in the United States and it's about 9:00 a.m. here, April 29th, over here in South Asia. So anyway we're ready to get started and let's look at the ... thanks Mary, and we'll get the first slide up.

M - Thank you Daniel. I think people are gonna love this. Here we go.

D - So this is about the 2022 Eclipse seasons and cycles, but our emphasis here today will be on the first Eclipse season. So the subjects we want to cover today: we'll look here next some Eclipse facts, some information about the upcoming Eclipse seasons history; a little bit of history about the current Nodal and Saros cycles; and then we'll talk about a more practical level, the connections with personal charts; and then also, making some ceremonial suggestions. And then, near the end, we'll take a look at a few notable charts to see how some well-known public figures, who have things on their charts that are connected to these Eclipse seasons. And then, at the very end, we'll look ahead to the *next* Eclipse season about six months from now.

So let's look and see what some of these Eclipse facts are.

So Eclipses are part of the complex relationship between the Sun, Moon and Earth. They are extra-potent New and Full Moons, which our school calls "Super New Moons," or "Super Full Moons. It's a little different than what the astronomers do with those terms right now. And, the reason we call them that is because they're hugely amplified New Moons and Full Moons. And there would be two of those each year for the Full Moon, and two for the New Moon. Eclipses occur when the Sun, Moon and Earth align and one casts the shadow, either the Earth, Solar Eclipse on the Moon, or the Earth's shadow is cast on

the Moon, during a Full Moon. This kind of alignment is often called a "Syzygy," which is a term used usually for Eclipses, but it actually can be also used for three or four planets together. So that can also be a Syzygy. Eclipses are and this is actually, this part now I'm going to share – show it – has to do with the really complex patterns of the Sun, Moon and Earth. And actually there are a number of different things that are brought into account for when we look at Eclipses: the Nodal cycles, and also the Saros cycle, and then also, the Sun and Moon cycles themselves. We actually have a whole course dedicated to that, because it's far more to teach in a short video blog like this.

So let's go on to the next one. Each year has two Eclipse Seasons separated by about six months. And in two days or so, we'll be going into the first Eclipse season of 2022. Every Eclipse season has at least two Eclipses: one Solar, one Lunar. Sometimes it can have three Eclipses, totaling six or five. Sometimes five, but then it could be as many as six, and this, this is rare. Much more rare than the situation, which is more "normal," this year. Each Solar Eclipse can be surrounded by two very minor penumbral Lunar Eclipses two weeks before, two weeks after; or a Total Lunar Eclipse is surrounded by two very minor partial Solar Eclipses two weeks before or after. That doesn't happen this year. As you see here, three in the season occurs about eight times every 28 years.

And just so you're all clear about this, Solar Eclipses will *always* occur *with* the New Moon, Super New Moon. So it's an *amplification* of the New Moon energy.

Let's look at the next one. Now one of the more unique features of the approach that our school and the

paradigm takes, is to look and see whether the Eclipse is at the North Node or the South Node, and here's a way in which the Saros cycle, which is the cycle of the different Eclipses, like families of Eclipses, will interact with the Nodal cycle. And we may, we use a lot of information about the Nodes and the use of the Nodes in the school. So it's kind of like the South Node is where we're coming from, and the North Node is what we're moving to. So there's a little bit of a more-future orientation when it's a North Node one, and the Solar, the partial Solar that's coming up in a couple of days, is a North Node one. Well, the really massive and powerful Total Lunar Eclipse two weeks later, is at the South Node. The pattern is reversed in the Eclipse season this fall.

So just to keep this clear, we're reiterating certain points here. So the Solar Eclipse at the North Node, which is the one we're about to have, THIS is "a seed point," in a place of conscious intention, a portal into possible futures if, and only if, the shadow of the personal and collective past is addressed. Now, all Eclipses have that shadow feature, but we could kind of say that the North Node ones have a bit less, than the South Node ones. But in either case, you don't want to just immediately go into the future. It always, with Eclipses has to do with taking into account the shadow, that mistakes that have happened in the mystery schools collectively, or also then, relative to your own personal chart. The idea here is that even if your own chart is not connected to where the Nodal axis, or the Saros cycle degrees are, you can still work with this ceremonially and collectively, based on the shadow and the mistakes of the past, associated with these signs.

The signs represent because the thing is, that the entirety of this Eclipse season is about the Taurus/Scorpio axis. And so, you can either be the South Node version of it or the North Node version of it. As you see here, the Lunar North Node Eclipse and we'll have one of those in the fall, it emphasizes the future the North Node is more about the future-directional flow, personal and collective humanity. And it can include our soul's intention to reach its destination point, but only after first addressing the past. And then we have the Lunar South Node Eclipse, which is the one that's coming up in two weeks and that strongly relates to our collective past and where personal and collective humanity have previously been. These may be areas where we need to have conscious awareness of, before we can go forward.

Let's take a look at how this is actually... we clearly are not going to have time historically, to look at all of this, but I wanted you to have this information, so you can see how the Nodal pattern, which is 18.6 years, and I said 19-years, because 18.6 rounds up to 19. And we have the Metonic Lunar Return at 19. And here we have the pattern of the North Node in Scorpio from 1910 on through 2096. And you can then zero in to where we are now: January 2022 to July 17, 2023. And then also, you can see the pattern of the South Node in Scorpio. We have the dates of all of that over there also. And so these interweave the North Node in Scorpio, the South Node in Scorpio. And that also then goes into the whole initiatory process of the Nodal Return, and the Nodal Reversal on individual charts, which we will speak about when we look at how you can use the Nodal pattern and the Eclipse pattern, related to your own individual chart. So this, the Nodal pattern 18.6, and we've given you the

information about the Scorpio and Taurus ones, but let's look at the next slide now.

Now we have the Saros Eclipse pattern, and I provided you with the dates here from 1950 to 2094, and here we are including the Saros 119, which is the Solar Saros, and then we're including the Lunar Saros of the Full Moon, a Total Eclipse, and you can see how long these families last. There's 71 events for the Solar... and actually Mary, just make note of this, that should be 72 events. It says, 21 events, that should actually be 72. I'm just noticing that typo at this point. So 71, or 72 events over a time period over a thousand years. I started this in 1950, because for the Solar Eclipse in this Saros 119, this is a fairly minor one, if what it is you're looking at for is Total Solar Eclipses. There were a series of annular Eclipses, but that one ended March 18, 1950, and now this particular Saros, you can see it ends 2112, is fading away. And if you look down from 1968, 1986, 2004 down to 2094, you can see the magnitude, it gets less and less. The one today or in a couple days 0.639. So what that number represents is the percentage of the Sun that is covered. So it would be a 1.0 if it reached totality. And by the time we get to 2094, it's really a partial Solar Eclipse.

Then on the right column is Saros 131, and this is a pretty powerful Lunar Eclipse sequence. It started in 1427 and you can see the magnitude is increasing, and on April 2, 1950 it was 1.0333, meaning it was just past where the Moon would be eclipsed by the shadow, okay. But then it increases, so by the time we get to the one on May 16th, it's almost one-and-a-half. So therefore, this becomes a more central location of the shadow on the Moon, but then it keeps increasing. The same Saros has its maxim one almost double, and that is a

really central one 1.8234. We've also provided you here, where the degrees are, so you can see here April 30, 2022, 10° Taurus, yes, and then we have the one at 25° Scorpio coming up May 15, end of 15, early May 16, depending on where you are. So there we have those degrees to work with for these. Now 10° and 25° Taurus/Scorpio, you can actually get a lot of insight and a lot of clues regarding how this works by looking back and forth between the Nodal pattern and the Eclipse pattern.

What do we have as the next slide? Oh, okay, wasn't there another one on Eclipse factoids, where it talks about the Saros?

M - It was at the very end here, where the Saros cycles, the very last point.

D - Right right that one, sorry, we didn't discuss that. If the degrees of the Eclipse are *within* 10 degrees on either side of your Sun, Moon, natal chart angles, or personal planets, you're in the front lines of the Eclipse. And then, you can also see how the Nodal cycles relate to that with the same idea. A Saros is a family of Eclipses that occurs every 18 years, 11 days. The repeating pattern of eclipse series occurs between 1226 and 1550 number of years and it says it's comprised of 69 to 87 Eclipses. The ones we're referring to this year is 71 events and 72 events, so it's kind of sort of right at, well one of them, not quite in the middle, kind of at the beginning, the Saros cycle. The Nodal cycle, remember the Saros is 18 years 11 days, the Nodal cycle is 18.6.

And then the third of a really important of the complex lunar cycles, is the Metonic, which happens every 19 years exactly. And they're the three most important cycles that involve the Moon. These rather complex cycles also include

the Lunar Standstill Cycle, of which we'll be talking a whole heck of a lot of going forward in these next couple of years, as we reach the Maxim Lunar Standstill in 2024-2025. Hopefully that's enough of just the factoids on it, okay. And again, we have like a whole course that covers all of this in some detail. It is rather complex, particularly when you start interweaving the Nodal cycle with the Saros cycles. Now, let's look at what the charts look like for...

M - Here's the one coming up. April 30th, partial Solar Eclipse

D - Which is slightly more than half, and it is actually if you want, if you're into the visibility aspect of it, it's a pretty narrow path. And the only parts of the Earth where this is actually seen as a partial, is in Antarctica, and a small portion of South America. It'll be partial all through the southern part of South America and then also, particularly, like along the coast of Chile, and Tierra del Fuego gets it pretty strong, and then western Antarctica. So it's not going to be visible in the area of the world where most of the people listening to this are going to be. It's still though is a Super New Moon, and if you happen to have on your natal chart something in those vicinities there, the vicinity of maybe from 5° to 15° Taurus/Scorpio, Leo/Aquarius, your chart would have a relationship here. I also want to mention another thing here, so you can maybe have a better understanding about how these Eclipse cycles work, and why they might be total or only partial. You'll notice here that the exact Sun/Moon conjunction is at 10° 28" Taurus. The North Node and as we said, this is a North Node Eclipse is 22°. That's 12°. It's got to be a lot closer to the Sun/Moon degree for it to be a Total Eclipse. If it was much further away than 12 degrees, then you don't even get a partial. So

that's just something to take note of when we get to it in a moment, when we look at the Full Moon Lunar Eclipse. And just notice for a moment, the remarkable configurations that are happening here. You'll see the marvelous and spectacular gathering of Mars, Venus, and Jupiter. We actually put up a Facebook post earlier, actually yesterday, about the Venus/Neptune conjunction and then we have, you can see, Venus and Jupiter there. And, at the point of the Solar Eclipse, it's within an hour-and-a-half of the *exact* conjunction of Venus and Jupiter at the time of the Eclipse. And then, notice that Uranus, how close Uranus is to the Sun and the Moon. So there's some very powerful signatures there. And for those who have been watching the morning sky, they're strung out beautifully: Saturn above Mars, Mars above Venus and Jupiter, that are getting closer and closer together. We could see that this morning here where we live. You might want to now reference the next one, which is the Venus/Jupiter conjunction, don't want to leave this out, even though it's not an Eclipse slide. But it's just because the Venus/Jupiter is so close to the Solar Eclipse, so it becomes a marvelous signature of the Solar Eclipse.

M - It's less than an hour later than the exact Eclipse, correct? Or the exact Moon/Sun conjunction?

D - Yeah. You know one of the things that we lucked out on over here, in this part of Asia, is that the point where they're closest together is about 5 in the morning here, while the point where they're closest together in the U.S. is during the day. So you could actually see them closest in the morning sky, two different morning skies, the morning sky before what, Saturday morning, and then also, Sunday morning I guess, right. So, but we'll see how close they

get. It'll be really interesting if we have a clear sky to see they're almost touching, they're like at the same declination, same longitude. Just for reference here, Venus and Jupiter together is not that rare, it happens every year between 11 and 15 months apart. But sometimes when they come together, they're not so easily seen. But we have a very great time period to notice Venus and Jupiter together in the morning sky, pretty high up. And also, just to remember when you are seeing this, that right behind them, close right behind, but not being seen, is Neptune. So it's a very very strong, you know, emphasis on Pisces. While meanwhile, we see the emphasis so strongly on Uranus, when we go over to the where the Sun and the Moon actually are. So that's a lot of the Upper World or Celestial World emphasis really, as far as I can see. And the Pisces emphasis, as we've done previous vlogcasts and some articles and seminars, we've emphasized the importance of the Jupiter/Neptune process, which is like seeding 166 years. So there's a lot of seeding going on here, including the seed point of this Eclipse season, which is the Super New Moon, which is the Moon/Sun conjunct from here in Taurus. While you're hearing me discuss this, as we are looking at these charts, just pay attention to, or you might already be thinking about how these configurations relate to your own personal chart. And I know there's a couple of... well the two of us that are speaking right now, definitely have connections. My own Nodal axis is Taurus/Scorpio and I have particular connection to this to the Lunar Eclipse and I believe very much you do too. We can discuss that when we go to the next chart

So here we have the Super Full Moon, South Node Eclipse. Why South Node Eclipse? Because the Moon is... look

how close it is, to the South Node, which is why it's a pretty central Total Eclipse. I should also note here that this particular Total Lunar Eclipse is very very prominently visible for people in North America. In fact every city, every major city, every part of the continental United States and Alaska actually also, will experience totality. We didn't put the data up on this, on the previous slides, but I just wanted to let you all know that the whole process of the Lunar Eclipse takes 5 hours and 19 minutes. And if you happen to be in a zone where you have all parts of it, okay, and the totality part of it, if you happen to be in a place, and even around Sacramento ... that far, the whole west coast of the United States. And also, where you live Mary, you get one hour and 24 minutes of totality. Actually, you're at the very point where I believe it's ...

Here's something it's really good for you all to know. There is a website you know, rather than me like telling you what time is it going to be in San Francisco, or in Kansas City, or Washington DC, or Anchorage, Alaska or Honolulu. There is a great website it's called, "time and date dot com," and it will show you with tremendous detail. And you can actually put in your cursor any city you want across the United States across Mexico across Canada, that will give you the beginning point, the amount of time that is total, and the end point of the Eclipse. It's a very useful tool, we won't see it over here in Asia however, the even slightly more central Lunar Eclipse that is happening The second Eclipse season will be centered in on Asia, and here's something that's actually quite interesting to know, which we'll have an opportunity to talk about a lot as we go through the other. Even more remarkable for the United States in particular Eclipses of 2023 and

2024, which is that the paths cross, you know the actual physical paths of the annular Eclipses and the Solar Eclipses, will cross in the United States, but you can actually, if you... the factor that a lot of people maybe not be aware of is that in this way the Saros' work, is that every third Eclipse. And that would also be true for the Lunar Eclipses too. And I looked this up Mary, because we talked about this previously, that every third Lunar Eclipse is centered on a particular area. Every third Solar Eclipse is centered in on a particular area, but the difference is that with the Lunar Eclipses it's half-half, it's just shifted around a little bit because it's based upon whether it's day or night. Well, the Solar Eclipses are a much narrower path, so you don't ever get a whole hemisphere experiencing it, but they do jump around over different parts of the globe. So keep that in mind. You all, in the U.S. area, will actually be the ones that get the experience for this next season. While those of us over here in Asia, will get the next one, which is in the fall. So pay attention, tune in. Again, you're looking at this to see how it lines up with your own charts, and I know for me, I have Mars at 25° Scorpio, so this should have some, I should be somehow connected with this, I would think. And how about you Mary? I know you got a lot going on with this.

M - I have my Mars and my Ascendant right there,

D - Within 5°,

M - Closer, I think even, yep, and then my Taurus Moon is opposite it, so yep.

D - And it's real close to the way your angles are.

M – Yes, yes. I have, that's true I have my Leo in Venus at 20°, so that's pretty close.

D – So, I mean, one of the ways I like to look at it is that if it's conjunct an angle or an inner planet, or if it's close to the Nodes, then we're using the imagery of New Moon and Full Moon, so therefore it's a seed point. Or when we're thinking of the Full Moon, it's like an illumination, so it's like the way we would think of working with the lunar cycle. Each month you have the New Moon seed point. And then you have the Full Moon, which is full consciousness. But then again, if we say full consciousness, we also have to say the reason why the ancients came up with something. Even more recent times the word "lunatic," was the fact that that full awareness is, it can sometimes be pretty hard to handle. So it's kind of overwhelming. It's like if you go out under a Full Moon, that which has usually been dark has now become shadow, you know so it's the illumination of that, and if we can see it with awareness, well then, great, we've expanded our awareness. Otherwise, it can be kind of scary. Actually, in some of the more mystic traditions, I heard this back when I was spending a lot of time taking people out to in groups for Lunar Eclipses, that there's definitely a phenomena that happens that where that shadow seems to be out. In fact, a well-known spiritual teacher, Pierre Vilayet, used to always say that the only time he liked to stay indoors was during a Lunar Eclipse. He was kind of afraid of it. Now I don't want to go that far with it, but I think that if you do a group for a Lunar Eclipse stay together as a group. You know, don't scatter or wander off alone. So it's really great to work at a ceremony with a group or you know, you focus your attention with one or two people, you know with your

partner or your small group or if you put together a group, should you have the courage to do that, then you gotta actually put a lot more intention into holding the space of it. So, yes, yes Mary?

M - I was gonna say, we really considered a time-out-of-time because what you said, that the spans of this is five hours. And so within that time we have an event that mirrors what normally would take what, 24 hours? So it's like a baby day within it .

D - Well no, what would take place over a month. So yeah, so it starts with the Full Moon, it wanes to a New Moon, when there's basically the Moon is not seen at all. There's no phase and then it builds back up to Full Moon, so that brings up, so certainly at the very least, it encapsulates in five hours, something that could be thought of as a full month. But I like to think of it as at least six months, a seed point for six months. But then, this is a question that the astrological community is not in agreement about, which is how long does the "effect" last? These days I think there's a presaging that happens even before. So you can have events that happen before, but then also, how long after? At least six months. I'm working with the idea of about three years. But this, as I say, there's different opinions on that and I would imagine that it also matters how total it is. So if you have a Total Solar, it would seem to me that that would, the range of "effects" from it, would be longer than if it's a partial. That's all really quite speculative as far as the global impact of it. I've seen enough evidence that the places where the track of the Solar Eclipse goes across the Earth, does seem to connect with events before and after. It'd be interesting to see with the partial Solar Eclipse being in Chile, and being in

Antarctica, whether ... who knows, it might relate to that large area of the west Antarctica ice shelf that is falling off, you know. So there's that. The intense drought that is happening in that part of Chile, and things like that. And we'll plan plenty of time to speculate on all of this when we talk about the tracks of the Total Solar and annular Eclipses that are crisscrossing the United States in 2023 and 2024. It's less clear about stuff like that with the Total Lunar Eclipse, because it covers like half the Earth. It just kind of shifts around a little bit, so it kind of comes back to the same point every third one.

Yes, so take note of this, and you will notice here that on this chart, that Saturn is also squaring the Nodal axis and the Eclipse degrees of the Sun and the Moon there. This Saturn is you know 24° Aquarius. And so don't forget to think of the squares now, and also the Leo/Aquarius configurations, and how that might relate to these degrees on your own chart.

I did want to offer a few more things here regarding ceremony. Now there's a lot of different ways to do ceremony. And you know like in the approach of our school, is it really depends archetypally on how elaborate the ceremony will be. I mean some people who don't necessarily want to do the total theatrical productions, just simply being aware of it, and being with it in presence, can be ceremony. So I mean maybe an Aries type is going to do it different than a Virgo type, for example. So, but still there's some general suggestions we can make, that I've noticed in working with Eclipses actually since the early 1980s. Say for the Lunar Eclipse that whole time period of where it's Full, and then it dwindles and it wanes to what is sometimes called "The Blood Moon,"

because it's a like a perigee Moon happening, that's the time period to actually be calling out, working with the shadow. Don't avoid that. And even if there's nothing to do with your own chart on it, you know consider the collective, the global, the historical circumstances of that. And then certainly if it's your own, be willing to look at that, and call it out. Then, during the exact point, which for the Lunar Eclipse is an hour-and-24 minutes, that's like a portal, and that's where basically, I would suggest, that we always suggest when we work with groups, that's like going into meditation, that's going into complete presence, and then and receiving whatever needs to be received, with an open heart. And then, as the Moon starts to come back, you know little by little by little, till it comes back to fullness, that would be the time of kind of speaking out, what you'd like things to be, you know, so it becomes like a powerful seeding for the next phase of world, global and personal history. I've even noticed that when we're talking about a five-hour time period, that it can be during those last couple of hours, that's when you can have celebration, that's when you can share your meal, song and dance. You know drumming and all the rest of that. So, that doesn't have to be in focused, silent meditation at that point. So that's like coming back into fullness right.

With a Solar Eclipse, it's kind of the same thing, except it's encapsulates shorter. So the point of the partial Eclipse or the Full Eclipse is the portal. But it's still kind of the same idea that before it becomes total, you're dealing with the shadow material, you receive transmission during the exact portal, and then it's the seeding. Then it's like what happens like after, I mean you can even look at it, is when you finally see the tiny crescent Sun all right, that could

be equivalent to seeing the tiny crescent Moon after the New Moon point. So you can actually think of the Sun in that respect, like the Moon. So this is just some ideas, and I'm very open to getting feedback from people who work with the Eclipses in different ways or see what happens if you try it this way and what your experiences are.

I don't want, I mean I could go on and on here about what are the things that have happened in previous Lunar Eclipse events that I've done. Boy, that's really really amazing stuff, that would go into a whole extra video to talk about that, the ones in Mount Shasta, the ones that Fayette Hot Springs, and when we've done Lunar Eclipse events at Gail's place in Sarita. we've done them. As far as the Total Solar, I've only seen two: The Great One that happened in Oregon on the west coast, I think you were part of that group.

M - Right I was, And we did do ceremony. Yep, we released what we no longer wanted while it was waning and then we burnt that, and then we announced our intention and put that in writing and gave it back to the mother after the main event, when it was coming back.

D - That was such a beautiful time to walk out, spent, you know we were hiked out about an hour or so out to the gorge, looking down at the Columbia River Gorge and looking across, at another portion of Oregon. And it was really cloudy at first, but then it just kind of dissipated just in time for it. The only other time that I personally have experienced a Total Solar was in Bolivia, up on the Altiplano of Bolivia, that was a really long one. But I've also struck out on a number of them you know, where you actually went all the way to the island of Mangala in the Cook Islands

for one, and it got... well that's a whole other story, which I won't get into now. But that one didn't work out. There's one in 1991, in Hawaii didn't work out either. It's, I'm kind of as you can tell from this conversation, I've been an Eclipse junkie very much. And the 2023-24 Eclipses have been on my mind a lot. So yes, this will create fertile ground in a pregnant space for the great work of the Greater Reset. Yes, deep within the deepest descent of the Kali Yuga, and part of this Great Turning of the Ages.

M - Right and if any of our people that are listening are living in parts of the world that will see that partial Solar, just a reminder to wear your protective lenses, and not look directly at the Sun.

D - Well, particularly for a partial, you can if you're in the umbra, you can look, but not when it's partial. Those lenses are really helpful for that. Actually, if you have one of those lenses, it's also a very cool way to look at all the Sunspots that are on the Sun right now.

M - Thank you for that. I'll pull mine out.

D - There's a huge amount of huge Sunspots, that's partly why we're having x-x-class coronal mass ejections, and all kinds of powerful aurora effects happening on the planet right now. Maybe that's could be thought of as the Neptune, the Celestial, the Neptune and the Uranian connection to all this stuff. So, let's see if there's anything else we...

Yeah well, just so you can get a sense of how to work with this on your natal chart, as I'm suggesting, if it's a conjunction is definitely an amplification. And the amplification like a Full Moon or a Super Full Moon or a Super New Moon, I would address, I would say just fairly large orbs for that.

In fact, probably the large orbs it would make sense to use the larger orbs *because* actually the Eclipses themselves having an even a partial lunar or a partial Solar will go up to about 15 degrees, between the degree of the Node and the degree of the actual Full Moon and the New Moon. So maybe having 10-15° orb, it can be useful, but obviously the closer the better. Yeah, so if it's really zeroed in on the exact degrees, then we're really on to something. I think it might be interesting at this point to jump ahead. I'm just feeling the flow on this right now, to jump ahead to the two that are in the fall.

M - Oh that's, what this is. This is October 25th, this is the first one in the second season of 22.

D - So here we have also a situation where the you can see the Nodes are quite far from where the Sun/Moon conjunction is, which is why it's a partial, and about half you know, so and we'll be doing another investigation of this Eclipse season later on, all dedicated to this. But I wanted you to see how these are still kind of in the same zone.

Here we have the Scorpio/Taurus, and in this time period, you'll see Uranus is still pretty strongly involved. In fact, we'll be having a whole extra seminar during our Solstice Seminars regarding the phenomena that happens in early October, which is, gesh, just stunning, which is on the same 24-hour time period, where you have the final closeness of Saturn square Uranus. I mean you can see Saturn squares Uranus within about one degree there. Saturn at 18° Aquarius, Uranus at 17° Taurus. But in early October, it's also the time when the North Node and Uranus are exactly conjunct – actually within the same few days, as when the exact

closest point of Saturn square Uranus, the fourth of those squares. You know, a lot of other people have been catching on to this, that the three exact squares of 2021, but it's not like Uranus-Saturn was over, because there's an almost exact, another square happening this fall. So take a look at that, You can also see that Venus in the Underworld there, you know, so in the Venus cycle, there is Venus conjunct the Sun there, so that one, which is the South Node Eclipse is happening at the point of the very close, to the greatest exactness of Venus in her Inanna Underworld sojourn. So that's also something that I'm sure we'll be talking a bunch about as we get closer to that time period. And you'll see also, that still there, I mean that's around the time period of the where Pluto is still rather strongly involved with the U.S. Pluto.

Let's take a look at the Full Moon,

M - That one's November 8th, that is the U.S. election day.

M - Wow

D - And Venus is still in the Underworld, with Mercury. But you'll see that it's a very central Full Lunar Eclipse. And why? Because you can see how close the Nodal axis is to the actual syzygy of the Moon and the Sun with the Node. So very major feature of the latter, the second Eclipse season of the year is the Venus underworld, just as currently it's that very powerful Neptunian influence, with Uranus, I mean, so Uranus is a player for both of them right.

So that's just a little preview of what's coming next. And you can see the same kinds of degrees are involved, you know it's still there in the mid-Taurus Scorpio and Saturn is at 18° still, you

know you see, so 18° Aquarius. So that that's like forming like a T-square with the Sun/Moon axis here. Again, it's just bringing into play... well your chart and mine you know still right, you know particularly yours, you know I mean because you got that 18°, I think pretty prominent and 22°, and that whole zone, and I'm sure that a bunch of you listening probably will notice you have the same phenomena. Now I thought.

M - Uranus right on there, I mean Uranus is conjuncted, isn't it pretty much?

D - Yeah yeah exactly. So I mean you know, I'm sure some people are noticing that just a few days after this Solar partial, is this, the day each year when the Sun and Uranus are conjunct. But here we have exactly on the Lunar Eclipse point, date November 8th, U.S. election date, there's Uranus exactly with the Moon and the North Node, you know, after it had been exactly on the North Node just a few weeks before that. So stunning, stunning stuff to consider as you go through this. And again, there's two ways to look at this and I keep talking about personal and collective. Yeah, your own chart may be on the front lines in the portal, in the Super Full-Moon, Super New-Moon and so on. But then again, on your personal chart you may not have a connection, but you can still in these portals, work with your own connection to the mistakes and the shadow, as well as what your intention would be for those signs. And then, the other thing would be - What about the collective? You know, the collectivity? And I thought it would be really interesting to look at some prominent, well-known figures, and some of the things that are in the news right now, to see whether there's a connection to these Eclipses.

M - Here we are.

D - So we're going to actually start by looking at the charts of Joe Biden and Putin, and they had their charts have an extremely interesting relationship with each other, worthy of a whole vlogcast to look at them, their dance. But you can see here that here not only is Joe Biden in his age, 79, Mars Return, the most exact Mars return, but look at the relationship of these Eclipses to his Scorpionic planets, even that 0° Taurus one there, is close to the second degree in the Eclipse season at the end of the year. So I would say that all of those Taurus and Scorpio placements are certainly connected to these two coming Eclipse seasons. The Lunar Eclipse in a couple of weeks is right on the Sun/Venus/Mercury area, particularly the Sun/Venus area of the chart, and then the Solar Eclipse is opposite to Mars on this chart. So he's definitely, he's definitely on the front lines of these Eclipse seasons. But take a look now at Putin's chart. Now you look here: Venus at 11° Scorpio, Scorpio-rising, Venus and Mars conjunct, between those two guys charts. There's something going on there, where one – they sure don't seem to like each other – but they get definitely something that they're working out. And look at the Jupiter 19° Taurus. So I would certainly say that there's a very strong relationship between the Eclipse seasons here, and this guy's chart, and then also his own Nodal axis. Look 19° Aquarius-19° Leo. You know, so that's also in the same zone.

Now speaking of that, let's look at the Russian Federation. This is the chart of the Russian Federation that was formed after the Bolshevik Revolution. And Putin seems to enjoy the boundaries and in the history that happened, from that time period, in the way he addresses the

situation in Ukraine. But, look at that chart and think of the connection between this chart and what we just saw with Putin's chart, and particularly Joe Biden's chart. No, not that one yet. Here we have the Soviet Union Federation from 1922: 27° Taurus Moon, Venus 28° Scorpio, Jupiter 13° Scorpio, the angles 18° Taurus/18° Scorpio. I think this can't be ignored, you know, I mean there's such a connection just between Putin's chart in this chart. And then the particular cycles of the Eclipse seasons that are happening to this chart. It's much to unpack with that, but I just definitely wanted to show you how the Russian Federation chart connects. You see there's not a whole lot on the U.S. chart that connects to this Eclipse season. But boy, is there ever in the following two years. So there's something very major being worked out here with Putin and the Russian Federation. And then, kind of like Biden, it his Mars return is kind of caught up in the same circuitry. I just wanted to throw it out here, not because there's as many connections, but just so you can see what Zielinski's chart looks like.

M - There you go,

D - There is the Leo portion of it. By the way, this is... this did not come out right. It should have been a Gemini rising chart. How did that happen? Um? Anyway his chart is actually Gemini rising, but the rest of it is accurate with Mars and the Moon in Leo. All right, let's see, do I have the actual...? it's actually 2 p.m., that's what happened there. So, if you look at this chart as a Gemini rising, there's literally no way you could have a better horoscope of an actor, and of course he is an actor. You know, we got all that Leo, and you've got the Gemini ascendant. It's a precise, perfect expression archetypal of an

actor, one who is like presents himself as part of a Hollywood production actually. And that's been going on a long time, and the chart really doesn't lie regarding it.

Just had a couple others here, very briefly to look at Xi Jinn Ping. Here we've got Pluto with 21° Leo, Venus at 8° Taurus and the Moon in 5° Leo. So basically that's the connection points on this chart, the Nodal axis, the Moon and Leo Pluto at 21° Leo, Venus is in Taurus. So there'd be those connections. There's a number of amazing connections between his chart and the chart of China itself. And it is not lost on those who look at all of this, that he does consider himself to be the successor to MaoTse Tung, although his chart is not quite as extreme as a Mao's chart. And then you have that for reference here if you want to see this.

And then, here we've got Anthony Fauci. Now there's no birth time on this guy, but here we have 22° Scorpio Mars and Moon at 4° Scorpio, Uranus at 22° Taurus. And then you have Saturn, look at Jupiter and Saturn, they're in those... it's right at all the same degrees we've been talking about. And Pluto square on the Moon/Saturn and opposed the Moon. Of course, the Moon could be a few later degrees than that, because it's 7 a.m. chart, we don't know this exact birth time, BUT clearly lots of that chart is involved in the current Eclipse seasons. And certainly we can say that for those, that follow this guy's career, he's being kind of being eclipsed right now, fortunately. But he's had a long run. I mean necessarily I mean sort of we can understand that when we see he was born with Jupiter/Saturn conjunct in Taurus. You know a long, a long life of being the head of the medical mafia for so long, you know. But that to me, that's the chart of the gangster right there, if any chart I've ever seen, quite

frankly. I mean. if we just look at it archetypally. All right and then, do we have anything else there?

Israel, See Israel is a really major player in this, it's the third most spoken language in Israel, Russian I mean, and there's some who say that actually some of which Israel is doing is pulling the strings, you know, including Kazazian connections, and the whole bigger story than we can do here. But you can see there is definitely a connection there with the Israel chart: the Sun at 23° Taurus, the Nodal axis of 14° Taurus/14° Scorpio, and then, look at Saturn in Leo with Pluto, you know. So there's a much being worked out when you look at the events happening in Israel and particularly with the Palestinians at this point, and the ways that they are actually pulling some strings behind the scenes, even when Zelensky said, "We want to turn the Ukraine into another Israel." Which is very interesting when you kind of see these kind of connections. So there's much to unpack regarding Israel's connection with all of this. And I think that's all we had right?

Oh yeah yeah, so I think we covered all of it and this hopefully gives you a lot to think about. And at the very least as those that work these ways with this kind of paradigm, the Shamanic Astrology Paradigm, who we always look at it with a three-worlds approach. We're tremendously aware of what's actually happening in front of us and objective reality; we also go to the Celestial, all that particularly from the Neptunian perspective, that all is well, there is this universal consciousness that exists no matter what it is that happens down here on planet Earth. And then there's the Underworld, which is not to be afraid of noticing where the shadow is, and what needs to be composted, both personally and collectively. And

just pay attention to these timings and as best as you can. And I'm sure we're not the only ones that are pointing this out. You know, work together with friends and allies and family to be aware of these timings and these portals, and what is possible, with a group intention and open-hearted intention to create a world that's better for the majority of the planet, not just humans but the animals, the anima mundi and the plants and all of the natural world.

Actually, I just thought of something to just close this with, which is a perfect Sabian Symbol for the Lunar Eclipse. It's just stunningly precise for what we're dealing with. It's the Rudhyarian image, "American Indians making camp after moving into a new territory. The ability to adjust to a new situation swiftly, by tuning into its requirements." And then Rudhyar writes this, "Those who live in harmony with nature, moving on as new needs arise, finds themselves intuitively at home everywhere. You do not make demands upon life, for they are identified with the great rhythms of the biosphere and its functions at peace with what they produce. This is the message of the American Indian culture, which European invaders so wantonly and meaninglessly destroyed nearly everywhere. Western man had lost faith in life because he wants to dominate and enslave manifestations." So that certainly describes the necessity to look at the collective shadow and mistakes of the dominant culture. And so we have an opportunity to do that now, and not to be afraid to look at it.
